85-89 (or Honours) - An excellent performance, demonstrating fluent technical and artistic skills with emerging individuality

80-84 (or Commended) - A convincing performance technically & artistically, with increasing stylistic & communication skills

75-79 (or Merit) - A competent performance, showing some artistic awareness and/or technical ability

70-74 (or Progressing) - A performance showing development of technique and/or communication and commitment

Rules

Introductions to all the pieces (whether they are set pieces or own choices) must be included in the timings.

VERSE SPEAKING

The focus of these classes is on the spoken word which includes the interpretation of the text maximising expression, emphasis, facial play, vocal colour and structure to enhance delivery and give homage to the basic tenets of verse speaking. Movement and gestures are not permitted.

POETRY DUOLOGUE/TRILOGUE

Entire text of published verse or prose selection to be performed by either two or three entrants. The focus on these classes is on the spoken word which includes the interpretation of the text, maximising expression, emphasis, facial play, vocal colour and structure to enhance delivery and give homage to the basic tenets of verse speaking. Limited use of hand gestures or vocal sound effects are acceptable if required, but physical movement or dance steps are not permitted.

SONNET CLASS

A sonnet is a poem that has 14 lines with a set rhyming pattern and structure, and typically has ten syllables per line.

CHORAL SPEAKING

The emphasis here is on a group spoken performance. This team work needs to include ensemble speaking within its interpretation of the text(s). Solo spoken lines are optional but not mandatory. Limited use of hand gestures or vocal sound effects are acceptable if required, but physical movement or dance steps are not permitted.

ACTED POEM OR STORY OR PROSE EXTRACT

No costume, minimal props may (optionally) be used, as long as these are relevant and appropriate to the recital performance. Entire text to be performed, with or without a narrator. Recorded music allowed - must bring own equipment. Discretion must be exercised in choosing material out of consideration for the venue.

MONOLOGUE

No costume, minimal props may (optionally) be used, as long as these are relevant and appropriate to the recital performance. Perform a monologue of your own choice from a published play, tv or film screen play, adapted novel or published monologues. Discretion must be exercised in choosing material out of consideration for the venue.

DRAMATIC SCENE

Schools, Clubs, Academies, etc. Please note school year groups are as at the time of the upcoming Festival. Scene or part-scene scripted or devised for 3 or more characters. Own choice. Discretion must be exercised in choosing material out of consideration for the venue. Duologues and group dramatic activity are not covered by the agreement with the Authors' Licensing and Collecting Society and copyright for these items should be sought by performers at the time of entry.

DEvised PIECE

Written, directed and performed by students. Devised piece for 3 or more characters. Discretion must be exercised in choosing material out of consideration for the venue

SIGHT READING

Test piece in either verse or prose, to be chosen by the Adjudicator at the Competition.

RECITAL CLASS - Senior (Age 13 - 17)

No costume, minimal props may (optionally) be used, as long as these are relevant and appropriate to the recital performance. Using published works, each competitor is to select a theme of his/her own choice and present a recital programme consisting of both poetry and prose. The readings do not have to be learned but the introduction, links between readings, and conclusion must be spoken from memory, and will be judged as part of the overall performance - to consist of a minimum of 3, maximum of 4 readings. Overall time limit: Min. 8, max. 12 minutes

RECITAL CLASS - Junior (Age 9 - 12)

No costume, minimal props may (optionally) be used, as long as these are relevant and appropriate to the recital performance. Using published works, each competitor is to select a theme of his/her own choice and present a recital programme consisting of both poetry and prose. The readings do not have to be learned but the introduction, links between readings, and conclusion must be spoken from memory, and will be judged as part of the overall performance - to consist of a minimum of 2, maximum of 3 readings. Overall time limit: Min. 5, max. 8 minutes

PREPARED PROSE READING

Entrants are required to read from the set book itself at the Festival - to encourage them to read the whole story, and to master the technique of reading aloud for performance. Teachers/performers are asked to ensure that readings are kept well within the time limit. A short introduction is required. Readers can either sit or stand for their performance.

THE AUDITION CLASS

For those preparing for an audition, this is a chance to practice or perform and gain feedback. Any dramatic excerpt from a published play, TV or film screenplay, adapted novel or published monologues. (Including classical texts) Own choice.

MUSICAL THEATRE CLASS

This is a class to demonstrate singing and performance and movement skills. Singing skills: including intonation, phrasing, correct breathing technique, right choice of song for voice; Performance skills: including interpretation of words, characterisation; Movement skills: any movement must be relevant and meaningful. The performer will be expected to set the scene. Costume must be worn as well as use of appropriate props in accordance to the copyright approval (see rules).

Where 'age' is pertinent to determining the appropriate class/fee, this is the age of the competitor(s) as at 31st AUGUST immediately preceding the Festival (any exceptions to this general rule will be stated against individual classes).

Rebecca read journalism at Cardiff University, during which time she wrote a weekly column for The

Guardian newspaper. She continues to work for a range of publications as a features writer, ghost writer, and theatre critic.

Rebecca then studied as an actor at the London Centre for Theatre Studies; and her theatre credits include off-West End, Fringe, tour, educational theatre and voiceover. Favourite roles include Maggie (Dancing at Lughnasa); Elizabeth (The Crucible); Beverley (Abigail's Party); Madame Arcati (Blithe Spirit); Martha (Who's Afraid of Virginia Woolf?)

Rebecca trained as a specialist drama teacher at The Guildhall. She has taught in a range of primary, secondary and tertiary educational institutions for the last twenty years; and is the Principal of her own drama school, which operates internationally. Rebecca's pupils have been awarded places at major conservatoires and bodies such as RADA, LAMDA, Central, Royal Academy of Music, Royal College of Music, Guildhall, Bristol Old Vic, Mountview, East 15, Guildford, AADA, Royal Birmingham, the Oxford School of Drama, National Youth Theatre, and the National Youth Music Theatre. Their work can be seen on the BBC, ITV, Sky, C4, E4, Netflix, Working Title, National Theatre, RSC, and with countless touring theatre companies in the UK and abroad.

Rebecca chairs the Adjudicator's Council for the British and International Federation of Festivals; sits on the Awards Panel for the UKPA; and is a LAMDA, GCSE and A level examiner.

In 2014, Rebecca was awarded the prestigious Fellowship of the Royal Society of Arts in recognition of her work in the youth theatre sector. Rebecca is passionate about helping performers take their first professional steps, and helps emerging talents to form and manage their own theatre companies. As such, Close Up Theatre, No Prophet Theatre, and Eleventh Hour Theatre have all played to critical and commercial acclaim at the Edinburgh Fringe Festival: kickstarting careers and forging critical industry networking opportunities.

Rebecca's productions have played to critical acclaim and commercial success at the Edinburgh Fringe since 2003. In addition to directing and producing over thirty thirty sell-out shows at the Fringe; Rebecca has adapted classics such as 1984, Jane Eyre, Emma, and Pride and Prejudice for the stage; and has written the original works More Myself Than I Am, Torn, Coward Conscience, and OTMA.

Rebecca is currently working on a PhD based around Shakespeare's history plays; and she is passionate about inclusivity and diversity in the Arts, spending her free time 'making things happen' for people who would otherwise have no agency within the creative sector.

3. Where movement or costume are included in a performance copyright permission is required and the festival committee accepts these entries on the basis that the appropriate copyright permission has been sought.
4. For those wanting to enter these classes, please note that they are outside of our PRS conditions (i.e. these classes you are encouraged to wear costumes, have characterisation and movement) therefore you will need to contact the organisation who holds the rights to that musical/show and seek permission. If you don't want to seek the rights, we have the Songs from the Shows classes in the Singing section for those not wearing costumes, movement etc. More information on the PRS can be found here.

When seeking permission, most of the time it is granted. You obviously need to find out who has the rights to ask though.

Obviously, using Google will assist you in the process. Whilst we claim no responsibility for external sites, you can look at the BMI (Broadcast Music Inc) and search here. There is also a website about Musical Theatre that has some good information including a page listing who holds the rights to many of the shows.

Once you have found out who has the rights, you will need to contact them, explain what you are doing at the festival and ask for permission.

Please note, the Festival does not accept liability for the infringement of copyright. The Festival contributes to a blanket copyright agreement but this only covers all items that fall within the PRS. Therefore, the Festival takes no responsibility for any item that is copyrighted in the Musical Theatre class as this falls outside of the blanket PRS agreement. I.e., If the trustees of the copyright pursue an illegal use of a piece performed at the Festival, it is the sole responsibility of the entrant to pay any fines that are imposed.

5. The use of photocopies of printed material without the publisher's permission is forbidden as contrary to law. However, when material is part of a volume, and not published separately, a copy may be made for the Adjudicator, provided that the entrant has already purchased a copy. The photocopy will be retained and then destroyed by the Festival.
6. CDs, backing tracks (not containing lyrics) or live music may be used but the performer must provide their own equipment to play and amplify.
7. Please note there are no 'changing facilities' at the venue.

Musical theatre class

This is a class to demonstrate singing and performance and movement skills. Singing skills: including intonation, phrasing, correct breathing technique, right choice of song for voice; Performance skills: including interpretation of words, characterisation; Movement skills: any movement must be relevant and meaningful. The performer will be expected to set the scene. Costume may be worn as well as use of appropriate props in accordance to the copyright approval (see rules).

Adjudicator

Joseph Tong MA(Cantab), DipRAM, LRAM, ARAM

Joseph Tong has established a reputation as one of the most versatile and imaginative pianists of his generation. He studied at Wells Cathedral School, Cambridge University and at the Royal Academy of Music in London with Christopher Elton. Much in demand as a soloist, duo pianist and chamber musician, Joseph made his Wigmore Hall recital debut in 1997 as winner of the Maisie Lewis Young Artists Award and now gives regular recitals throughout the UK and Europe.

Joseph Tong has been particularly associated with the piano music of Jean Sibelius, having recorded three discs of a complete cycle for the Quartz label to critical acclaim and performing regularly in Finland over recent years. He has twice been invited to play at the Korpo Sibelius Festival, taking part in a Sibelius piano 'marathon' with five other pianists in 2019, and has given several recitals on the composer's original Steinway at Ainola. Joseph has also performed at the Helsinki Musiikkitalo (Camerata Hall), Hämeenlinna City Hall, the Sibelius Museum in Turku and, most recently, at the 2024 Joensuu Music Festival.

Other recent projects have included a new commission from the British composer David Matthews, a set of Five Trees which Joseph premiered at the Three Choirs Festival in 2022. He also performed the new work at the Sibelius Museum in Turku as part of a collaboration with the Åbo University Foundation, recording a third album of Sibelius's piano music which was released in 2023.

Joseph has made several critically acclaimed recordings as a soloist and chamber musician including a disc of Schumann, released in 2019 on the Quartz label, which was awarded Instrumental Choice in BBC Music Magazine. Much in demand as a collaborative pianist, his recording of Sibelius works for violin and piano with the British violinist Fenella Humphreys on Resonus Classics was selected as 'Chamber Choice' in BBC Music Magazine in 2022 and featured on BBC Radio 3's Record Review programme. Joseph has also made piano duet recordings of Schubert, Debussy and McCabe in his longstanding duo with Waka Hasegawa, with whom he performed at Wigmore Hall in London, at Music Festivals including Cheltenham, Buxton, York and Oundle as well as in Japan and USA.

He also performs regularly with his brother Daniel, having appeared on Radio 3's In Tune together and giving recent piano duet recitals at Conway Hall in London, St David's Hall Cardiff, and the Laidlaw Music Centre at the University of St Andrews.

In 2022 he returned to Wigmore Hall to give a solo recital featuring Schubert's Wanderer Fantasy, marking 200 years since the work was written. Other recent highlights have included solo recitals in Spain and Germany including the Sendesaal in Bremen and Kloster Konzerte in St. Blasien, St George's Bristol, Chichester Cathedral, Hatchlands in Surrey and the Presteigne Festival in Wales.

A passionate advocate for new music, Joseph gave the world premiere of Lara Poe's Koivunrungot Kaarella at Presteigne last summer and has recently commissioned a new work, The Willows Suite,

from the Finnish pianist-composer Terhi Dostal.

Joseph was elected an Associate of the Royal Academy of Music (ARAM) in 2008 and has been a music adjudicator for the British and International Federation of Festivals since 2019. He is one of the senior piano tutors at Wells Cathedral School and coordinator of the Wells International Piano Summer School. Joseph will also be joining the faculty of the Chetham's International Piano Summer School in 2025 and has recently been invited to adjudicate piano prizes at the Royal Birmingham Conservatoire and the Guildhall School of Music & Drama.

OFFICIAL ACCOMPANIST

Singers are welcome to use their own choice of accompanist, but if needed, we offer an official accompanist (piano). Singers must select the option to use the official accompanist when entering online.

Fees

There is a fee for this service payable on entry, which has been subsidised by the festival and can be found in the syllabus below. The fee covers the cost of a short run-through (10 min) in advance of the festival plus the performance.

Rehearsing

After scheduling is finalised in mid-October, entrants will be contacted with the details of the official accompanists. The entrant will then contact an accompanist of their choosing (availability permitting) to arrange a 10 min run-through before the festival. If additional rehearsal time is needed, singers should arrange this directly with the accompanist at a rate of £30 per hour. It is unlikely that there will be an opportunity to rehearse with the accompanist at the venue on the day of the performance.

Sheet Music

Singers should provide a copy of their music for the accompanist at the run-through or in advance, as advised. The music must be in the correct key, and any repeats or cuts should be clearly marked. Chord charts with lyrics are not acceptable. Additionally, a second copy of the music will still be required for the adjudicator.

Rules

Candidates are reminded that:

- Songs may not be used twice.
- Recorded accompaniments are not permitted, unless otherwise stated.
- In general, competitors are expected to sing from memory, unless otherwise stated.
- While choirs are not required to sing from memory, over-reliance on the score may inhibit communication and this may be reflected in the marks awarded.
- Competitors should provide a copy of their song(s) for the adjudicator. The copies should be brought to the Festival and handed in at the time of the performance. Failure to do so may result in a loss of marks.

Where 'age' is pertinent to determining the appropriate class/fee, this is the age of the competitor(s) as at 31st AUGUST immediately preceding the Festival (any exceptions to this general rule will be

stated against individual classes).

Adjudicator

Bryan Husband GRSM (Hons), ADWCMD

Bryan studied at the Royal College of Music, London, and the Welsh College of Music and Drama in Cardiff. He spent much of his performing career living abroad, performing in continental opera houses and concert venues; he and his partner now have homes in Hertfordshire and Malvern.

For 18 years Bryan was a Vocal Lecturer on the Musical Theatre BA programme at Trinity Laban Conservatoire, and a Music Examiner for one of the top music examining boards for 14 years; he now runs a private practice, gives workshops ('belting' to audition techniques), performs, adjudicates, and works as a ski instructor! Performances include tv and radio broadcasts, opera, oratorio and recital.

Having enjoyed a lifelong association with competitive performance festivals, and being a passionate advocate for education and opportunity in this widest sense Bryan was selected to become an adjudicator for The British and International Federation of Festivals in 2005. Since then adjudication has since taken him to many Festivals around the UK and Ireland, also to Hong Kong, Gibraltar and Trinidad & Tobago. Examining took him all round UK and Southern Ireland, and further afield to hear instrumentalists and vocalists in classical, Musical Theatre and Rock & Pop, from beginners to Fellowship diplomas.

In his spare time, Bryan spends time with his grandchildren (and their parents, of course!), attends a lot of diverse theatre, volunteers with various environmental Trusts, and enjoys gardening, skiing and walking.

The singer is responsible for arranging their own accompanist at both the festival and for the concert. For the concert, a £100 bursary will be provided to help cover accompanist fees and expenses.

The adjudicators will take into consideration the choice and variety of the programme submitted. Arias originally composed for performance with orchestra must be sung in the original key. All repertoire must be sung in the original language. The programme is to be sung from memory with the exception of the oratorio item which may be sung from the score in accordance with traditional performance practice. Candidates are required to provide their own accompanist. Application details may be shared with the trustees of Freda Parry Scholarship Fund (their data protection policy can be found here: <https://fredaparryscholarship.org/data-protection>). In the event of a large number of applications, a preliminary round will be held. Previous recipients of the award are not eligible to apply.
