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General Rules and Regulations

WHO MAY PERFORM

The Stratford & East London Music Festival is open to amateurs only, except the Open Classes which are also open to professionals. An amateur is considered as one who does not derive the main part of his/ her income from the subject entered. Students under 18 years of age are considered to be amateurs for the purposes of the competitions.

Where age limits apply, they refer to the competitor's age on 1 September 2022. For group entries, the class is determined by the age of the oldest competitor in the group, unless the class is 'Open'.

Unless otherwise stated, competitors may perform once only in each class, except in duet, trio or ensemble classes where a competitor may perform more than once, provided that a different part is performed. Solo competitors may not enter a class if, for three consecutive years, they have been the winner of that class. Solo competitors may not enter a class if they have received tuition from the adjudicator in the last two years. Conductors may not sing with their choirs.

HOW TO ENTER

Entries may be made online at www.playandperform.co.uk/selmf. This link is also accessible via our website at www.stratfordmusicfestival.org.uk.

All entries must be received by 30 December 2022.

Entry fees cannot be returned except for classes cancelled by the decision of the committee. The trustees are prepared to offer limited assistance with travel costs in the case of hardship for Junior and Infant School Choirs only. Please contact the Festival Secretary.

DATA PROTECTION

Under the terms of GDPR, the Stratford & East London Music Festival undertakes not to pass on any information about competitors or members, and to use such information only for the purpose of the Festival.

BEFORE THE EVENT

Information will be sent to competitors at least ten days before the date of the competition. Where there is only one entrant in a class, that entrant will be informed and given the opportunity to withdraw and have his/ her fee returned. The committee reserves the right to limit, cancel or subdivide any class, or to combine two similar classes, or to transfer classes from one day to another. In exceptional circumstances, there may be a change of adjudicator.

THE PERFORMANCE

Only stewards, performers and their accompanists will be allowed in the performing area. Copies of 'own choice' pieces must be handed to the adjudicator's steward before their performance. The candidate's name and class number should be written on every copy. The Festival is bound by

copyright law and cannot allow tape, video, mobile phone or any form of recording equipment to be used. It is in breach of copyright and is an offence. The individual as well as the Festival may be fined. In the large group competitions held at St Mary's Church, photographs may be taken of the group at the end of each performance, provided that this complies with parent's wishes and/ or the individual school's policy on this matter. In all other sections, only officials of the Festival may take photographs. Please refer to the Child Protection Policy for further information.

ADJUDICATION

The adjudicators' decisions are final. Awards may be withheld if, in the opinion of the adjudicator, sufficient merit is not shown. No entrant, teacher or interested party may discuss any aspect of the Festival with an adjudicator before, during or after classes, except at the invitation of the adjudicator. Adjudications and certificates are normally available at the end of each class. NB Competitors who do not perform at the scheduled time will not receive any marks.

MARKING SYSTEM

First prize winners, who gain 84% or above, are awarded either trophies or medals. In classes where there are ten or more entries, a second place medal is awarded. The British and International Federation of Festivals has agreed

the following descriptors for use by adjudicators and certificates will be awarded as follows:

Outstanding: 90% and over - An exceptional performance, both technically and artistically

Distinction: 87% to 89% - An excellent performance technically and artistically Commended: 84% to 86% - A convincing performance technically and artistically

Merit: 81% to 83% - A capable performance showing some artistic appreciation and/ or technical ability

Moderate: 78% to 80% - A performance showing development of technique and or communication

Fair: 75% to 77% - A performance limited in its communication

TIME LIMITS

Time limits must be observed. If a competitor chooses to introduce their item, this must be included in the overall time limit where set. The performance may be stopped if the time limit is exceeded.

SET PIECES

If any difficulty arises in obtaining the set pieces, please contact the section convenor.

OWN CHOICE PIECES

Full details of the title and composer/ author of 'own choice' items must be shown on the entry form. Any competitor who does not perform their stated choice will receive adjudication but will NOT receive marks or a certificate or be eligible for an award, or any prize. Any competitor who fails to provide a copy of their 'own choice' piece will receive adjudication but will NOT receive marks or a certificate. Competitors may not perform the same 'own choice' in more than one class - except for Millennium Classes.

COPYRIGHT

For Speech & Drama competitors, it is not necessary to seek copyright permission to perform poetry, prose or solo dramatic items. Competitors entering duologues and group dramatic activity classes must contact publishers for permission to perform and pay the required fee. Competitors must produce evidence of copyright clearance. Items must be announced with title and author at the time of performance. Words or gender of a character must not be changed. For Music competitors, if the 'own choice' composition is from a large publication and the piece is not published separately, one copy may be made for the use of the adjudicator. The copy will be retained and destroyed after the competition. The accompanist should always be given a printed copy of the music. Music which has been downloaded from the internet must be accompanied by the permission statement which accompanies the music.

ACCOMPANIST

The availability of an official accompanist is subject to competitors stating on the entry form that they require this service. There is an additional fee and this must be sent with the entry. It is generally possible to have a short run-through in the hour preceding the class. Most music can be handed to the accompanist on the day of the competition. More advanced pieces (eg Lieder, Recital and Grade 5 and above) should be sent to the Entries Secretary, SELMF, 113 Prospect Road, Woodford Green, Essex, IG8 7ND. The accompaniments supplied must be in the correct key. The use of a 'backing' CD or cassette tape is acceptable provided that it does not infringe any copyright restrictions.

TROPHIES

Trophies and/ or medals will normally be presented after the class. Trophies which are awarded for the highest marks in a particular section will be presented during the Young Musician Competition on the evening of Saturday 18 February 2023. All cups and trophies remain the property of the Stratford & East London Music Festival. They are held by the winners for eleven months and must be returned before 10 January 2023. Winners must sign for receipt of the cup or trophy. Winners are required to enter into a bond of safe custody of the cup or trophy and to bear the cost if they wish to have their names engraved on it.

ADMISSION TO COMPETITIONS

Competitors and their accompanists are admitted without charge. Children of school age and competitors' music/ drama teachers are admitted without charge. Friends of the Stratford & East London Music Festival are admitted without charge. Other visitors will be required to pay fee for admission.

All classes have a time limit of ten minutes. Please remember to give the number in each group on the entry form.

Where an own choice work is selected from a publication containing several different works which is not published separately, one copy may be made for the use of the adjudicator provided that the choir has already purchased its own copy. The photocopy made will be retained and destroyed immediately after the event.

The accompanist should always be given a printed copy - it is illegal to perform from photocopies of published music.

In the case of junior and infant choirs, if the piece is improvised or taught by ear then the requirement to provide a copy can be waived. In all other cases, a copy must be provided in order to receive an adjudication.

All pieces in this section can be played with or without accompaniment, or they can be accompanied by a backing track.

Adjudicator

NANCY LITTEN LRAM (piano, violin), ATCL (voice), FLCM, Cert Ed., ProfCertRAM, FRSA

Nancy entered the Royal Academy of Music at 16 on an open piano scholarship, winning prizes whilst there. She has performed as a pianist in solo, orchestral and chamber music. She is an all-round musician, also having been a freelance orchestral violinist and leader of a string quartet, teacher of singing, and choral director. She was the pianist on Kent Music's orchestral and wind band Summer Schools for 23 years and spent several years as accompanist and coach for the Gurkha Band.

Alfred Music UK has published a range of her books: 'Keyed Up' tutors for electronic keyboard, 'Playing with Colour' tutors for violin, 'Choral and Vocal Warm-ups for pianists', 'Choral and Vocal Sight Singing with keyboard harmony', 'Rounds with Accompaniment'; and arrangements of piano pieces for piano trio, 'Classical Vienna' and 'Romantic Vienna'. Her original pieces and arrangements are set for MTB, Trinity and ABRSM grades on keyboard, piano, flute, clarinet, saxophone and singing.

Nancy has been an ABRSM examiner for 25 years and is an adjudicator for BIFF, serving on the Adjudicators' Council. She is chair of EPTA (European Piano Teachers' Association) UK's Kent region, and of the Kent and Medway Young Musicians' Trust.

Adjudicator

TIMOTHY BARRATT ARAM, GRSM, LRAM, ARCM, LMusTCL

Timothy Barratt studied on a Scholarship at the Royal Academy of Music, winning many major awards, and completed his studies with Vlado Perlemuter in Paris and Geoffrey Parsons. He has toured and broadcast extensively in the UK and abroad as soloist, accompanist and chamber music player. Whilst still a student he developed a special interest in song accompaniment through playing for Masterclasses at Aldeburgh, subsequently partnering such artists as Dame Felicity Lott and Robert White. Teaching forms a major part of his musical life and he works with pupils of all ages and levels from beginner to post-graduate. He was Head of Keyboard at Dulwich College for almost 25 years whilst also teaching at the RAM and TCM, and he pursues a busy freelance career.

An ABRSM examiner since 1991, he is also a Trainer, Moderator and Mentor. Other work for the Associated Board includes selecting the graded piano examination pieces and presenting educational seminars. He frequently directs masterclasses for performers and teachers' workshops in the UK and Far East, and is much in demand as a competition and festival adjudicator.

JANE WILKINSON BMUS (Hons) RCS Grad Dip RCM

Lancastrian soprano Jane Wilkinson started her training at a young age with three music scholarships and a place in the National Youth Choir of Great Britain. After winning competitions across the country she accepted a place at the Royal Conservatoire of Scotland to complete a BMus with Honours. She then completed her Graduate Diploma at the Royal College of Music.

Whilst at the RCM she won the Godfrey van Someren Competition for English Song and was a runner up in the BBC Radio 3 Kiri Te Kanawa Competition. Her career has taken her to South Africa and to Europe on solo concert tours. Performances have taken place in such venues as Edinburgh Festival Theatre, The Usher Hall, Bridgewater Hall, Royal Albert Hall and many more.

At present, Jane is a singing tutor at Imperial College London and Brunel University. She conducts New Malden Voices and New Malden Youth Choir. She has a busy recording and performing schedule alongside adjudicating for the Federation of Festivals.

Li Lin Teo, a Singaporean, studied with Dennis Murdoch at the Royal Academy of Music on an Associated Board Scholarship and won most of the piano prizes there, including the Macfarren Gold Medal - the highest award for piano playing at the Academy. She also participated in Master Classes with Vlado Perlemuter, Guido Agosti and Carlo Zecchi in Europe. After leaving the Academy, she studied with Louis Kentner.

Later, she was to combine teaching with concerto engagements, solo and duo recitals, and chamber music in the UK (including the Wigmore Hall and the South Bank), European countries, Singapore, Colombo, Hong Kong and Australia, together with Radio and TV recitals in France and the Far East. In 1988 Li Lin became an examiner for the ABRSM, and in 1992 an adjudicator for the British and International Federation of Festivals, being invited to adjudicate in Sri Lanka as well as at many prestigious festivals in the UK. She was also made an Associate of the RAM for 'distinguished services to music' in 1992.

Li Lin currently has a large teaching practice at home, and also at North London Collegiate School, where she has numerous Distinctions and prize winners in Associated Board examinations and competitive festivals.

There are no extra fees to pay for this section. Up to ten young musicians (pianists, vocalists and instrumentalists) aged 11-17 yrs will be selected to take part in this competition.

Competitors will be chosen on the basis of their performance during the festival. There are no specific qualifying classes, but competitors will be required to perform a recital of up to ten minutes.

Entering recital classes in the main festival will provide a good showcase for a competitor's selection. Competitors will be allowed to play/ sing items which they have already performed elsewhere in the festival.

Nancy entered the Royal Academy of Music at 16 on an open piano scholarship, winning prizes whilst there. She has performed as a pianist in solo, orchestral and chamber music. She is an all-round musician, also having been a freelance orchestral violinist and leader of a string quartet, teacher of singing, and choral director. She was the pianist on Kent Music's orchestral and wind band Summer Schools for 23 years and spent several years as accompanist and coach for the Gurkha Band.

Alfred Music UK has published a range of her books: 'Keyed Up' tutors for electronic keyboard, 'Playing with Colour' tutors for violin, 'Choral and Vocal Warm-ups for pianists', 'Choral and Vocal Sight Singing with keyboard harmony', 'Rounds with Accompaniment'; and arrangements of piano pieces for piano trio, 'Classical Vienna' and 'Romantic Vienna'. Her original pieces and arrangements are set for MTB, Trinity and ABRSM grades on keyboard, piano, flute, clarinet, saxophone and singing.

Nancy has been an ABRSM examiner for 25 years and is an adjudicator for BIFF, serving on the Adjudicators' Council. She is chair of EPTA (European Piano Teachers' Association) UK's Kent region, and of the Kent and Medway Young Musicians' Trust.

TIMOTHY BARRATT ARAM, GRSM, LRAM, ARCM, LMusTCL

Timothy Barratt studied on a Scholarship at the Royal Academy of Music, winning many major awards, and completed his studies with Vlado Perlemuter in Paris and Geoffrey Parsons. He has toured and broadcast extensively in the UK and abroad as soloist, accompanist and chamber music player. Whilst still a student he developed a special interest in song accompaniment through playing for Masterclasses at Aldeburgh, subsequently partnering such artists as Dame Felicity Lott and Robert White. Teaching forms a major part of his musical life and he works with pupils of all ages and levels from beginner to post-graduate. He was Head of Keyboard at Dulwich College for almost 25 years whilst also teaching at the RAM and TCM, and he pursues a busy freelance career.

An ABRSM examiner since 1991, he is also a Trainer, Moderator and Mentor. Other work for the Associated Board includes selecting the graded piano examination pieces and presenting educational seminars. He frequently directs masterclasses for performers and teachers' workshops in the UK and Far East, and is much in demand as a competition and festival adjudicator.
