Michael Lunney is the British/Irish Artistic Director/Producer of Middle Ground Theatre Co Ltd and has been since its inauguration in 1988. He has produced/directed over fifty UK/Eire theatre tours playing the likes of Bath Theatre Royal, The Gaiety Dublin, The Mayflower Southampton, Grand Opera House Belfast, Nottingham Theatre Royal, The Olympia Dublin, Plymouth Theatre Royal, His Majesty's Theatre Aberdeen, Oxford Playhouse, Cambridge Arts Theatre, Brighton Theatre Royal, Lime Tree Theatre Limerick, Norwich Theatre Royal, Yvonne Arnaud Guildford, Malvern Theatres, Theatr Clwyd Mold, Theatre Royal York, Alhambra Theatre Bradford, New Theatre Cardiff and Kings Theatre Edinburgh to name but a few. He also produced/directed charitable performances of 'Meeting Joe Strummer' at The Arts Theatre, West End in 2007.

THE MICHAEL LUNNEY PRIZE

This will be awarded to a competitor who has given an exceptional performance in acting. The winner will be awarded a week's work experience with Middle Ground Theatre Company Ltd at one of the touring theatres to be found on our itineraries in the autumn of 2026 or the spring of 2027.

ROTARY YOUNG PERFORMER OF THE YEAR

This trophy, kindly donated by Worcester Severn Rotary, will be awarded to a competitor of 12 years or under, who has given an outstanding performance in drama.

INNER WHEEL YOUNG PERFORMER OF THE YEAR TROPHY

This trophy, kindly donated by Worcester Severn Rotary, will be awarded to a competitor of 12 years or under, who has given an outstanding performance in music.

In addition, there are several classes across the festival where specific trophies and prizes are awarded. Winners will be expected to perform at the Festival Concert on Saturday 21st March 2026. These include:

000 MARIAN BAKER MEMORIAL PRIZE AND CUP: This prize was donated by the friends and family of the late Marian Baker, a teacher from Kidderminster. Two contrasting pieces of a minimum of Grade 6 standard may be presented on any instrument of voice by any performer aged 12 years or under on 1st September 2025. The prize will be £45 providing Distinction or Honours is achieved.

001 SPROULE PRIZE & TROPHY FOR SPEECH, DRAMA AND MUSIC UP TO 15 YEARS: Any performer aged 15 years or under may perform a poem or an acted scene AND a song or a piece of music on any instrument of the candidate's choice. The Sproule Trophy and £50 will be awarded, providing distinction or honours is achieved.

002 WILLIAM LEWIS RECITAL PRIZE AND SALVER: This prize was donated by the parents and friends of the late William Lewis of Stourport. An interesting, varied programme of two or more contrasting pieces of a minimum of Grade 6 standard for any instrument or voice should be presented, choice of which will be taken into account in adjudication. The William Lewis Salver & £100 will be awarded, providing distinction or honours is achieved.

304 OPEN CLASS FOR PIANO SOLO: The winner of this class will receive the Vale Trophy (kindly donated by Vale Pianos) at the Festival Concert, provided they receive an honours or distinction certificate.

613 OPEN CLASS FOR LIEDER: The winner of this class will receive the Susan Ellis Lieder Prize at the Festival Concert. The prize will be £50, providing the winner gains a Distinction or Honours certificate.

WCAF JUNIOR AND SENIOR CHOIRS OF THE YEAR: The WCAF Junior and Senior Choir of the Year trophies and prizes are donated by Jan Venables, who is a long-standing and much valued committee member, with connections to the festival stretching back to her own childhood. The titles,

trophies and prize of £50 will be awarded at the adjudicator's discretion to one choir achieving distinction or honours in any of the choral classes 1300/1301/1302/1308/1309/1310 and one choir achieving distinction or honours in any of the choral classes 1303/1304/1311/1312 choral sections.

930 FESTIVAL PRIZE FOR SOLO ACTING - 20 YEARS AND UNDER: Programme of acting of three contrasting characters of the performer's own choice. A prize of £50 will be awarded providing the winner gains a Distinction or Honours certificate.

1006 BERTULIS SOLO VERSE SPEAKING CHALLENGE TROPHY: The winners of classes 1000, 1001 and 1002 (Set Verse Speaking classes for all ages 12 years and under on 1st September 2023) will be invited to perform again to compete for the Bertulis Solo Verse Speaking Challenge Trophy. This additional class will take place on Saturday 21st March 2026, ahead of the Festival Concert.

1231/1232/1233 THE MARY MANNION COMPOSITION TROPHY: This trophy and a voucher to the value of £15 may be awarded at the adjudicator's discretion to the winner of class 1231/1232/1233 for Instrumental or Song Composition.

General Rules and Regulations

WORCESTERSHIRE CREATIVE ARTS FESTIVAL RULES 2026

Reviewed and applicable from: 1st September 2025

GENERAL

1. Entries open on 1st September 2025 and must be submitted electronically via the PlayandPerform platform by 23:45 on 19th December 2025. Verbal or paper entries will not be accepted.
2. The person making the entries should ensure that each entrant is aware of all the rules and has read the Safeguarding Policy and the Privacy documents.
3. No entry can be accepted unless accompanied by the correct fee. Fees can be paid via credit or debit card or by BACS transfer at the point of making the entry via PlayandPerform. Cheque payment may be accepted in exceptional circumstances. Please email admin@wcaf.org.uk to discuss.
4. Where relevant, adjudicators copies, manuscripts of original work, videos and backing tracks and must be submitted electronically by 23:45 on 16th January 2026. Late submissions may not be accepted and entry fees may be forfeited if submissions are not received by the deadline.
5. Entries may be withdrawn at any point, but fees are non-refundable. Competitors withdrawing from classes are asked to let us know as early as possible: admin@wcaf.org.uk
6. The Committee reserves the right to:
 - i. Offer and withdraw discounts or free entry offers;
 - ii. Change any class to a virtual class, meaning that video submissions will be required by the advertised deadline;
 - iii. Cancel any class and return the fee;
 - iv. Divide and/or combine some classes;
 - v. Change the order of individual performers in a class and if necessary, the class itself; and
 - vi. Make any changes necessary to the festival to accommodate any current government guidance.
7. The Competitor's age on 1st September 2025 shall be regarded as his/her age for the purposes of the competitions. (This corresponds with the academic year 1st September - 31st August.) Therefore, age groups usually equate to the following school year groups:
 - 8 years and under - School year 4 and below
 - 10 years and under - School year 6 and below
 - 12 years and under - School year 8 and below
 - 14 years and under - School year 10 and below
 - 16 years and under - School year 12 and belowIf you have any queries regarding this (for example, if a child is in a different school year than would be expected) please contact us: admin@wcaf.org.uk to discuss.
8. Open categories can be entered by anyone of any age. Entrants to Open Adult solo categories should be aged 18 or over. For ensembles, if the majority of members are aged 18 or over, this may be acceptable. Please email: admin@wcaf.org.uk to discuss, if necessary.
9. Competitors may enter only ONE age or standard class plus the OPEN CLASS in each SECTION. Performances on two DIFFERENT instruments may be entered in the same class/section. Individuals may take part in more than one group or ensemble in the same section.
10. A different piece must be played or performed for each entry in the same section. Pieces performed in any section may be performed again in the special classes.
11. It is the performer's responsibility to ensure that they have the correct equipment and music to enable them to perform. Due to difficulties experienced in other recent festivals, our festival advises against the sole use of digital devices as a digital score.
12. Competitors who overrun time limits or perform in the incorrect genre will receive adjudicator's comments only and will not be placed. The adjudicator's decision is final and in no circumstances will any subsequent discussion or correspondence be entered into.
13. No eating or drinking is allowed in the performance rooms (except at the Marr's Bar), but water

bottles are permitted.

14. Individuals should bring their own music stands with them. Bands and orchestras requiring music stands please contact admin@wcaf.org.uk AT LEAST one week before the festival.

15. Recording and photography of Classes is NOT allowed during performances and adjudications. We may have an official photographer who will take photographs during festival days, which may subsequently be used by the Press or on the Festival website. Where parents, guardians or carers do not wish photos to be taken at all, then the responsible adult attending should ensure that a committee member is aware so that their child/pupil/vulnerable adult is not included in official authorised photos.

16. One of the following categories will be awarded to each performance: Developing, Progressing, Merit, Commended, Honours, Outstanding, Exceptional. In all cases the Adjudicator's decision will be final. The Adjudicator will announce the winner of each class. In classes of 5 or more, a 2nd place will also be awarded. In classes of 10 or more, a 3rd place will also be awarded.

17. Copies of the Adjudicator's remarks should be collected from the steward at the close of each Class. Certificates should be collected from the certificate area in the foyer. There may be a slight delay, as certificates are prepared as quickly as possible following the end of the class.

18. Trophy winners are required to sign a form on receipt of their trophy.

19. The timetable will be available in advance on the WCAF website: www.wcaf.org.uk It is the competitor's responsibility to ensure they are in the correct place at the right time. A map and signage will be available at the venue.

MUSIC CLASSES

20. In classes where the time limit is 5 minutes or less, ONE PIECE is to be performed. Where the time limit is 6 minutes or more, ONE or TWO pieces may be performed unless otherwise stated. Timings should include breaks between pieces. The competitor should give an introduction (no longer than 30 seconds) including the title of the piece to be performed.

21. A copy of own choice pieces must be provided for the Adjudicator in the same key as the performance. For Rock and Pop and Jazz classes, a formal score might not always be appropriate, but a chord tab or crib sheet MUST be provided instead, clearly indicating the title and composer. Unauthorised copying of music is an infringement of copyright. If the music is out of print, permission to copy MUST be obtained in writing from the publishers and a copy of their letter or email attached to the music. The Music Publishers' Association has issued a code of practice making the concession that own choice pieces may be copied from volumes only and for the use of the Adjudicator only. The copying of music for the accompanist is forbidden. Photocopies for the Adjudicator must be totally legible. With the exception of the above concession, no other photocopying of music is permitted. If music is downloaded from the internet, the performer should also print off and submit the permission statement that accompanies the music. The adjudicators' photocopies will not be returned.

22. We may be able to provide an accompanist, but this cannot be guaranteed. Please indicate when making your entry that this would be your preference so that numbers can be assessed. Where necessary, competitors should bring their own accompanist (and page turner where necessary). Pre-recorded backing tracks are only acceptable where stated in the syllabus.

23. Where specifically stated in the syllabus, high quality backing tracks may be used, providing that they are balanced and do not detract from the overall performance. Where backing tracks are used, they must be uploaded by 16th January 2026. The backing track should not include the same vocal line or instrument that is being performed. Performers are responsible for ensuring that the uploaded version is correct.

MUSICAL THEATRE, POETRY, PROSE AND DRAMA CLASSES

24. The Festival has an agreement with the Authors' Licensing and Collecting Society. This means that entrants do not have to seek copyright permission for any poetry, prose or SOLO dramatic item performed, to a time limit of 15 minutes. Authors will be directly reimbursed as a consequence of their works being performed at this Festival. Duologues and group dramatic activity are NOT covered by this agreement and copyright for these items should be sought by performers at the time

of entry.

25. The title and author of all own choice pieces should be uploaded to Play and Perform by the deadline. A copy of own choice pieces must be handed to the adjudicator's steward at the beginning of the class for all except Musical Theatre.

26. For poetry, prose and drama classes, competitors are reminded that due to Performing Rights, no costume or scenery may be used but movement and basic props are allowed. The following props are acceptable - practice skirts, practice trousers, scarves, shawls, headwear, gloves, fans and other hand-held small items. Competitors in these classes are allowed to provide their own prompts. Competitors should NOT wear stage makeup.

27. For musical theatre classes, competitors are reminded that due to Performing Rights, only a suggestion of costume or makeup may be used. Scenery and basic props are permitted if they can be carried on and off the stage by the performer themselves.

28. Unacceptable Language Thresholds. Some works performed often explore adult themes, and contain strong language. However, care should be taken when choosing or devising contemporary pieces. We ask that you present your work in a manner that respects the 'family' orientated nature of the festival and avoids the unnecessary exposure of younger children to inappropriate themes and language. Therefore, all entrants to the speech, drama and musical theatre sections are now asked to confirm whether their performance contains adult language or content upon entry. If you indicate you have potentially contentious language or themes, a representative from WCAF will be in contact to discuss and a copy of the piece as you intend to perform it must be sent prior to the festival. Four letter words (e.g. f****) must be replaced by milder expletives, and such expletives should be used only sparingly. The festival aims to celebrate the best and highest forms of literature and language, and therefore reserves the right to refuse entries that are made up of continuously bad language and/or gratuitous expletives.

ADMISSION

29. The Festival is run by volunteers but, in order to hire the venue and pay professional adjudicators, a charge for admission has to be made. Schools and groups are asked to let spectators know that a charge will be made. A day consists of three 'sessions'. Members of the public will be admitted to spectate at the festival at a charge of:

Adults £5 per session or £10 per day (multi-day discounts available)

Children (under 18) Free

30. Competitors, teachers, conductors and accompanists are admitted free of charge.

31. Programmes covering all days of the Festival will be available priced £5.

32. Spectator tickets and programmes will be available in advance via the WCAF website and on the door on the days of the festival. Please bring your proof of purchase to reception on the day of the festival to receive your entry wristbands.

33. Car parking and disabled access is limited at some venues. Please contact admin@wcaf.org.uk well in advance so that arrangements can be made for disabled access if necessary.

We welcome all choirs of any age, ability or experience to come and take part in WCAF, singing any style of music. There are both non-competitive and competitive performance opportunities. The choral sections take place on Saturday 7th March 2026. There will also be the opportunity for one of our adjudicators to visit local schools to hear your performances if it is not possible to attend the festival. Up to 2 contrasting pieces should be performed within the time limit for the class (including the introduction and breaks between pieces). Different pieces must be played or performed for each entry in this section. Performances in these classes may be accompanied. If you choose to use a backing track rather than a live accompanist, the backing track must be uploaded to PlayandPerform by 23:45 on 16th January 2026. Any backing track must not contain vocals and should be purely instrumental. Please note the additional information as you make the entry.

We are pleased to announce that in addition to the trophies for winning an individual class, three Worcestershire Choir of the Year trophies will be available this year. There will be three categories - Junior (any choir in categories 1300, 1301, 1302 1308, 1308, 1310 or 1316), Senior (any choir in categories 1303, 1304, 1305, 1311, 1312, 1313 or 1317) and Adult (1306, 1307, 1314, 1315 or 1318). The award will be made at the adjudicator's discretion. Each trophy will be accompanied by a prize of £50. Trophy winners must get a distinction or honours mark and will be invited to sing at the Festival Concert on Saturday 21st March 2026.

Ensembles made up of exactly the same performers may enter only one class appropriate for the age of the eldest performer and/or the open class in this section. Please ensure that the age of the eldest performer on 1st September 2025 is given in all except Open Adult classes. Conductors of any age are permitted.

Ensembles entering the Open Adult classes may include performers under the age of 18 but the majority of performers must be over 18. This will enable classes to be split fairly if there are too many entries. Individual performers may perform as part of more than one ensemble. Ensembles may also wish to enter the small or large ensemble classes, found in the general classes section.

PLEASE NOTE THAT THE AGES STATED ARE ON THE 1st SEPTEMBER 2025, TO ALIGN WITH THE ACADEMIC YEAR. Previous entrants may notice that the age groups have been recently updated across WCAF to align with school years. The ages are also included but please be aware this refers to the age of the individual on 1st September 2025. All performances in these classes should be accompanied and 'live' accompaniment is preferred. However, if you use a backing track this must be uploaded to PlayandPerform by 16th January 2026. Any backing track must not contain vocals and should be purely instrumental. Please note the additional information as you make the entry.

Performers should introduce their song(s) at the beginning of their performance. The introduction should include the performer's name, song title, the show from which the song comes and the name of the character who sings it. More information may be included within the time limit for the class. Timings should include introduction and any breaks between pieces. This year sheet music or a copy of all lyrics do not need to be provided for the adjudicator.

Full details of the piece(s) to be performed do not have to be included at the time of entry (simply put TBC) but please ensure entries are updated with the name and composer of the piece by 16th January 2026 at the latest.

Scenery and hand-held props may be used, as long as the performer can carry everything on to stage themselves in one attempt. A suggestion of costume (including makeup) may be worn. However, the use of scenery, costume and makeup are optional and will not affect the mark given.

Unacceptable Language Thresholds: Some songs performed explore adult themes and/or contain strong language. Extra care should be taken when choosing or devising contemporary pieces. We ask that you present your work in a manner that respects the 'family' orientated nature of WCAF and avoids the unnecessary exposure of younger children to inappropriate themes and language. WCAF aims to celebrate the best and highest forms of literature and therefore reserves the right to refuse entries that contain bad language. Therefore, all entrants to the speech, drama and musical theatre sections are now asked to confirm whether their performance contains adult language or content upon entry. If you indicate you have potentially contentious language or themes, we will be in contact to discuss. This does not necessarily mean you will not be able to perform the piece - we just want to make sure that we make appropriate arrangements for you to be able to perform to your best.

Musical Theatre Solo

Own choice of musical theatre solo. Age guidelines are given for each class and competitors should enter only the class most appropriate for their age on 1st September 2025 and/or the open class. In addition, solo performers may wish to enter the following classes that can be found in the 'Special Classes' section:

- Performers who are Grade 6 standard or above AND were aged 12 years or under on 1st September 2025 may also wish to enter the Marian Baker Memorial Prize and Cup class.
- Performers who also love speech and drama and were aged 15 years or under on 1st September 2025 may also wish to enter the Sproule Prize & Trophy for Speech, Drama and Music.
- Performers of any age who are grade 6 standard or above may also wish to enter the William Lewis Recital Prize and Salver class.

PLEASE NOTE THAT PIECES PERFORMED IN THE MUSICAL THEATRE SECTION MAY ALSO BE PERFORMED IN THE ABOVE SPECIAL CLASSES

Performers are reminded that due to Performing Rights restrictions, neither full costume/makeup nor scenery may be used but movement and basic props are permitted. The following items are acceptable: scarves/shawls, headwear, gloves, fans and other hand-held small items. Performers must announce the name of the poem and the poet at the start of their performance. Brief context may be given if relevant, but this is included within the time limit. Chosen verse to be performed from memory. No props or costumes are allowed, except for in classes 1020-1024 (Group Dramatised Verse) where movement, sound effects and hand props may be used.

WCAF Poetry Slam

This gives poets of all ages, abilities and experience the opportunity to perform their own poetry and get feedback from a fantastic team of judges and a supportive audience.

The Slam will take place over four rounds. In round one, everyone will perform their own poetry. You will have a 3 minute maximum time slot. You may perform one poem or a few poems in this time but do not go over your 3-minute time limit! You do not have to use up the full 3 minutes. The judges will then score each performance.

If you score enough points to move into round two, the Quarter-Final, you will perform different poetry, again up to 3 minutes maximum.

If you score enough points to head into round three, the Semi-Final, you will perform a third time (again, different poetry) for up to 3 minutes maximum.

If you score enough points to head into round four, the final, you will perform a fourth time for up to 3 minutes maximum. It is up to you whether you perform different poetry or include poems you have already performed in the final.

You will need to enter the slam with enough poems to see you through what could be 3 rounds - if you score enough points! Please also write and upload a short introduction that will be read out to the audience before you come on stage to perform in round one. This can be a biographical note, or something about the poetry you are about to perform, or anything else you'd like to say by way of introduction, comical or serious! Your intro must be up to 30 words maximum, and can be written in either the first or third person.

Can I perform other people's poetry? No. Each poet must perform a different piece or pieces of their own poetry in each round. Do I have to learn my poems or can I read them? You may read your poems or recite them from memory.

Can I use props or music? You are not permitted to use, musical instruments, soundtracks or backing music/sounds. You may use small props if necessary.

Can I perform poetry with 'adult' themes and swearing? Audience members are aware that the event may contain adult language and subject matter. We will not censor poets. Your poems may be serious or comical and on any theme. Poets are permitted to issue a short 'trigger' warning before poems of a sensitive nature. This must be clearly indicated as a trigger warning and will not be included in the three minute time limit. The trigger warning must NOT be part of the poem.

Do I have to be a published poet or a professional performance poet to take part in the Slam? Anyone can take part - from an absolute beginner to a seasoned slammer. All you need is a heart that beats, and a mind that speaks.
