The Springboard Strings weekend is open to players of all ages of violin, viola, cello, double bass and harp at all levels. Note that in 2026 we are including the opportunity to play the harp in all our classes.

Please take time to read the rules below to ensure that you enter the appropriate class.

The deadline for entries is the close of 28 January 2026.

## Rules

- 1 Age limit: Unless specified, the age limit is 19 years, based on the performer's age on 31 December in the year prior to the Festival. There are several classes open to adults.
- 2 Any piece of music may be played only once in the Festival.
- 3 Music chosen for the graded classes does not have to be from an exam syllabus but the adjudicator's decision as to the acceptable grading of the performer's chosen piece will in all cases be final. The Strings Secretary will be happy to give advice on this.
- 4 Time limit: Performers are asked to pay close attention to the time limit for each class. A performance that is over the time limit may not receive a mark in a competitive class. Repeats are not required unless Da Capo or Dal Segno is marked.
- 5 A copy of the music to be performed must be brought to the festival for the adjudicator to refer to during the performance. Photocopies are acceptable but will be destroyed after the class.
- 6 Performers are expected to announce the composer and title of the piece(s) they will be playing clearly and audibly at the start of their performance.
- 7 Accompanists: Unless an arrangement has been made by their teacher, performers must book

and pay for their own accompanist, where needed. Please see http://www.springboardfestival.co.uk/information/accompanists/ for a list of local accompanists.

8 All performers (excluding accompanists) must be amateurs (someone in full-time or higher education or who does not derive their main income from performance or teaching a string instrument).

9 PLEASE NOTE that Springboard reserves the right not to refund entry fees if an entrant decides to withdraw.

# Adjudicator

## Alison Moncrieff-Kelly

Alison Moncrieff-Kelly won a scholarship to the Royal Academy of Music in 1979, where she studied with Florence Hooton. She was also a chamber music student of Sidney Griller and a piano student of Alexander Kelly. She made her South Bank debut in the Park Lane Group Young Artists series during this time as a member of the Latarche clarinet trio.

She has performed and broadcast all over the world as soloist and chamber musician, specialising in piano trio repertoire. She has made a number of successful recordings, including the complete piano trios of Hummel, the piano trios of Clara Schumann and Saint-Saens, the complete cello and piano works of Stanford and three discs of solo cello repertoire. Alison has recently published the first in a three book series of pieces for cello learners she co-wrote with Thomas Hewitt-Jones. All twelve pieces have also been recorded by them and can be heard on all platforms. In 2005, Alison was awarded the Heinrich Boll fellowship, a residency in Ireland - the first musician to be given the award. From 2007 until 2012, she was Director of Music at The Conservatoire in Blackheath.

As well as being an adjudicator, Alison is an examiner for ABRSM in classical, jazz and diploma exams. Since 2007 she has been a syllabus consultant for ABRSM, selecting the exam material, and part of the team that compiled the ABRSM cello scales and sight-reading material. She and Tim Wells also created and edited a book of cello pieces for ABRSM, Principal Cello.

Alison was made an Associate of the Royal Academy of Music in 2013, an award conferred for distinguished services to the music profession. She is a sought-after teacher and coach and has run many successful workshops for children and adults. She has particularly strong experience in the teaching of gifted children, and in coaching chamber music.

## **Beginner Strings Performances**

## **Adult Learners - Non-competitive**

The following classes are for adult amateur players of violin, viola, cello, double bass & harp. Amateur is defined in Rule 1 of the Festival General Rules and Regulations: "Springboard is a festival for amateur performers. For this purpose, an amateur is defined as one who is in full-time or higher education or is over the age of 22 and does not derive fees from performance or teaching of the subject of the class for which the entry is made. Professionals may only participate as accompanists or conductors or where otherwise specifically stated."

#### Recitals

Open to players of violin, viola, cello, double bass & harp. Performers should select two or three pieces, contrasting in style or period, and prepare a short verbal introduction to the works they are going to perform. Choice of programme will be taken into consideration.

#### Concertos

Open to players of violin, viola, cello, double bass & harp. One or more movements of a concerto or a piece with orchestra of similar stature. Orchestral parts must be played as a piano arrangement. Only the performance of the soloist will be adjudicated.

### **Duets and Ensembles: Non-Competitive**

Duets should involve two string instruments, with or without a piano accompaniment. Single or double concertos allowed.

Ensembles should involve three or more performers (maximum 12), at least four of whom must be string players. Ideally, there should be one person per part.

Ideally, all players should conform to the stipulated age limit, but please email the Section Secretary if this presents a problem.

The performance of the duet or ensemble will be adjudicated based on the standard of ensemble playing and on evidence of listening to each other, rather than on the difficulty of the music performed.
