Mini grants for young musicians!

Secretary at barbara@rbmt.org.uk, giving brief details of your address, school attended, the category you are entering, and the name and email address of your accompanist (as the Trust will pay them directly).

The Robert Bouffler Music Trust deed says that when considering requests for support, preference should be 'given to families of limited means', so we hope that applicants will respect this and only apply where there is a genuine need for support.

CONCERTO COMPETITION Syllabus

Entries open 01/01/2024 and close 28/02/2024 Thursday 21 and Friday 22 March, The Music School, Reigate Grammar School

The Concerto Competition is open to instrumentalists under the age of 20 on 1 May 2024. Performers are invited to perform one movement of a concerto (or another work for soloist with orchestra), with piano accompaniment. Double concertos may also be included. There will be two pianos available so that pianists can play with a second piano. Please consult our list of accompanists or choose one of your own.

The competition will take place over two consecutive evenings. There will be a winner each evening and one of those winners will be invited to play their concerto movement with Redhill Sinfonia. Previous winners may enter but will not be awarded this prize for a second time. To be considered for this opportunity, performers should ideally play a work written between 1750 and 1870. For concertos outside this period, please ask for advice from the Section Secretary. The number of entrants will be limited and a waiting list will operate if the competition is over-subscribed.

Adjudicator

Christine Pendrill

Christine was born and grew up in Reigate and started to learn the oboe at school under a scheme funded by Surrey County Council. A year later, she gained a place at the Junior Department of the Royal College of Music, winning one of six Associated Board Scholarships awarded annually to study there full time when she was eighteen. While at the RCM, Christine was introduced to the cor anglais which quickly became her first love and, while still a student, she began to freelance with the London orchestras. In 1980, Christine joined the Philharmonia Orchestra as Principal Cor Anglais and five years later, was offered the same position in the London Symphony Orchestra. Less than a year after joining, Christine became the first woman in the orchestra's eighty two year history to be elected by the players to the LSO Board of Directors, a role she fulfilled for three years. As an orchestral player, Christine travelled extensively, performing with the finest conductors and soloists. Her tenure in the LSO saw her work under Principal Conductors Claudio Abbado, Michael Tilson Thomas, Sir Colin Davis, Valery Gergiev and Sir Simon Rattle. During her career, she recorded most of the major symphonic cor anglais solos and also played on numerous film and TV soundtracks, including the Star Wars prequels, Harry Potter, The Imitation Game and The English Patient. In 1996, Christine gave the world premiere of 'The World's Ransoming' by James MacMillan, a concertante work commissioned for her and the LSO, which she recorded for the LSO Live label with Sir Colin Davis and went on to perform over twenty times. Having retired from the LSO in 2022 after thirty six years, Christine continues to teach the cor anglais at the Royal College of Music, to give masterclasses, examine and adjudicate.

Sarah Jefferies is a graduate of the Royal Academy of Music, where she studied with Patricia Clark and Josephine Veasey. Whilst at the Academy, Sarah won many prizes, ranging from Lieder to Opera and English Song, and was the recipient of the Ann E Lloyd Scholarship to fund her post graduate studies. She was an active member of the Opera course, singing several leading roles. After leaving the RAM, Sarah studied in Amsterdam with Margret Honig and Ella Ameling and began a long period working at the Opera D'Lyon, whilst undertaking recitals with the pianist Paul Turner, as well as oratorios and concerts all over Europe. Highlights of a busy career have been Canteloube's 'Songs of the Auvergne' at the Edinburgh Festival, and performances of Schoenberg's 'Moses und Aaron,' Puccini's 'Madama Butterfly' and Orff's 'Carmina Burana' with the LPO under the baton of Kent Nagano. Sarah is a visiting singing teacher to Marlborough College in Wiltshire, where she teaches all standards of student ranging from Grade 1 through to Diploma, firmly believing that everyone should be helped to find their own voice.

Caroline Harrison

Caroline studied at the Royal Academy of Music and, in 1988, joined the Royal Liverpool Philharmonic Orchestra as Associate Principal Viola before taking up the position of Co Principal Viola with the BBC Symphony Orchestra in 1990, a position she held for over 30 years. During that time she toured the world both with the Orchestra and as a chamber musician and soloist playing with various ensembles. Caroline recorded Mozart's Sinfonia Concertante with violinist Ludwig Mueller and the Orquestra de Cadaques conducted by Sir Neville Marriner. She has also taught on the orchestra specialism post-graduate course at the Royal College of Music and has been invited to judge on BBC Young Musician of the Year on several occasions.

During lockdown, Caroline offered recitals via Zoom to retirement villages which were very successful, and continued afterwards with a regular group of listeners.

Caroline left the BBC Symphony Orchestra in 2021 to enjoy a more varied musical life. Since leaving, she is regularly invited to play at Glyndebourne and enjoys invitations to play as Guest Principal Viola with orchestras all over the country as well as giving various chamber music recitals.

Clara Rodriguez

'The Venezuelan virtuoso pianist Clara Rodriguez' -Financial Times- has built an enviable international reputation for her innovative programme planning, juxtaposing standard repertoire with works by South American composers and has commissioned, premièred and is the dedicatee of over thirty works. Her playing stands out for its sheer beauty of tone, high expressiveness, sensitivity and considerable digital clarity, combined with stylistic acumen. Still a teenager, she was awarded the Teresa Carreño Scholarship, which enabled her to come to London to study at the Royal College of Music with Phyllis Sellick. At the RCM she was the recipient of many prizes and awards including the Scarlatti Prize, the Mozart Prize, and the Percy Buck Award, was a finalist in the Chappell Prize and performed concertos by Mozart, De Falla, and Gershwin. In Caracas, at seventeen, she made her debut playing Mozart's Piano Concerto K595 with the Simón Bolívar Orchestra under the baton of José Antonio Abreu. Her London debut took place at St. John's Smith Square playing the Ravel Concerto in 1985. Before coming to London, pianist Guiomar Narváez was Clara Rodriguez's first piano teacher. She has also received tuition from Paul Badura-Skoda (Austria), Niel Immelman (U.K.), Irina Zaritskaya (Russia) and Regina Smendzianka (Poland). Clara Rodriguez's career as a solo pianist has taken her to perform to great acclaim in the U.K., France, Spain, Italy, Denmark, Finland, Venezuela, the United States, India, Egypt, Syria, and Tunisia. In London, she is a hugely popular performer who regularly plays in recitals and as soloist with orchestra in the most prestigious halls including the Southbank Centre and the Wigmore Hall. Clara Rodriguez is often interviewed by the BBC and her CDs constantly feature on the BBC Radio stations and in networks world-wide. She has recorded six solo albums for Nimbus Records that include the piano works by Moisés Moleiro, Federico Ruiz, Teresa Carreño, Ernesto Lecuona, 'Venezuela', 'Americas without frontiers' and her release of late works by Chopin can be found on the Ulysses Arts label. She teaches at the Junior Department of the Royal College of Music.

Rebecca Coomber MA (Cantab)

Born in North Lincolnshire, Rebecca started playing the piano at the age of six. When she was 14, she was invited to help out the organist at the local church and she began to take organ lessons, at first locally and later at Lincoln Cathedral with Roger Bryan. In 1990 she was awarded an Organ Scholarship to Sidney Sussex College, Cambridge - the only woman in her year to be successful. In the College Chapel she and her fellow organ scholar were responsible for accompanying and directing two choral evensong services per week. Whilst at Cambridge, in addition to studying for her Music degree she studied the organ with Anne Page. She continues to play the organ at local churches, most recently at St Bartholomew's, Leigh.

Rebecca has performed both in the UK (including the Royal Albert Hall, Royal Festival Hall and King's College Chapel, Cambridge) and abroad.

Rebecca is passionate about teaching and music education and is currently a peripatetic teacher at Chinthurst School and the Reigate Grammar School Saturday Music College. She has experience

of teaching pupils of all ages, including her own three boys when they were younger.

Also a string player, Rebecca teaches the violin and plays the viola. She has been a member of many orchestras and string quartets over the years. As a personal challenge, Rebecca's latest hobby has been learning new musical instruments. She began first with the cello in 2018 and during the past summer has taken up the clarinet. This is a constant reminder to her of the challenges of starting to play any instrument.

Having performed in many music festivals herself over the years, Rebecca is excited to adjudicate at this year's Festival.

Tomos hopes to inspire a younger generation of harpists by giving masterclasses (recently at the Gower Festival) and with his busy private teaching practice, and as harp teacher at Charterhouse School and Sevenoaks School. Born in Cardiff, Tomos attended the Junior course of the Royal Welsh College of Music & Drama and was a chorister at Llandaff Cathedral before being awarded a Major Music Scholarship to Eton College. He studied with Gabriella Dall'Olio at Trinity Laban Conservatoire of Music & Dance where he graduated with First Class Honours and completed his Master of Music course with Distinction, winning the John Marson Prize for an outstanding musician.
