The Springboard Woodwind and Brass day is open to players at all levels. Please take time to read the rules below to ensure that you enter the appropriate class.

The deadline for entries is the close of 28 January 2022.

Rules

1 Age limit: Unless specified, the age limit is 19 years, based on the performer's age on 31 December in the year prior to the Festival. There are several classes open to adults.

2 Any piece of music may be played only once in the Festival.

3 Music chosen for the graded classes does not have to be from an exam syllabus but the adjudicator's decision as to the acceptable grading of a piece will be final. The Section Secretary, c/o admin@springboardfestival.co.uk, will be happy to give advice on this.

4 Time limit: Performers are asked to pay close attention to the time limit for each class. A performance that is over the time limit may not receive a mark in a competitive class. Repeats are not required unless Da Capo or Dal Segno is marked.

5 A copy of the music to be performed must be brought to the festival for the adjudicator to refer to during the performance. Photocopies are acceptable but will be destroyed immediately after the class.

6 Performers are expected to announce the composer and title of the piece(s) they will be playing clearly and audibly at the start of their performance.

7 Accompanists: Unless an arrangement has been made by their teacher, performers must book and pay for their own accompanist, where needed. Please see <http://www.springboardfestival.co.uk/information/accompanists/> for a list of local accompanists.

8 Please note that all performers (excluding accompanists) must be amateurs (someone in full-time or higher education or who does not derive their main income from performance or teaching a string instrument).

9 PLEASE NOTE that Springboard reserves the right not to refund entry fees if an entrant decides to withdraw.

Adjudicator

Rosanna Whitfield

Rosie's vast experience as a performer, teacher, examiner and presenter, teamed with an innate love of music, underpins her unstoppable drive as a dedicated campaigner for music in education. As Director of Music at Whitgift School, she devised numerous educational projects and regularly presented interactive concerts and masterclasses to thousands of primary school pupils.

She was instrumental in developing the Whitgift International Music Competition in 2013, and continues to support and mentor young musicians hoping for a career in the profession.

As an International Consultant, Rosie has worked with numerous families to assist them in both finding the perfect UK school and applying for Music Scholarships.

Woodwind and Brass Performances

In these classes, performers will play as part of a concert. They will receive oral and written feedback from the adjudicator but no mark. Any style of music is welcome: e.g. classical music, jazz, folk, pop, film, own composition. Performers may play in groups with more than one player on the same part.

Woodwind Graded Classes

In graded classes, the grade is a guide to the standard of playing, but performers do not have to have taken graded exams to enter. Entrants should be working towards the stated grade or entering that grade in the Spring Term. They must not have passed the grade examination at the time of entry. A performer may not enter for more than one graded class unless performing on different instruments.

Brass Graded Classes

Adult Learners

The following classes are for woodwind and brass amateurs only, as defined in Rule 1 of the Festival General Rules and Regulations: Springboard is a festival for amateur performers. For this purpose, an amateur is defined as one who is in full-time or higher education or is over the age of 22 and does not derive fees from performance or teaching of the subject of the class for which the entry is made. Professionals may only participate as accompanists or conductors or where otherwise specifically stated.

817 ADULT - NON-COMPETITIVE (Grade 5 and below)

818 ADULT - NON-COMPETITIVE (Grade 6 and above)

19 and older. Up to 6 mins.

Small Ensembles (Duets, trios and quartets)

Any combination of wind and brass instruments. Piano, keyboard or guitar etc. are permitted as accompaniment. Accompanist may be a teacher or professional.

819 SMALL ENSEMBLES - COMPETITIVE (Up to grade 5)

Fee £8.50

Group of 2 to 4 people

19 and younger. Up to 4 mins.

820 SMALL ENSEMBLES - COMPETITIVE (Grade 6 and above)

Fee £9.50

Group of 2 to 4 people

19 and younger. Up to 6 mins.

Larger Ensembles

A minimum of 5 players - no maximum but please state number on entry form. Any number of parts, any number to a part. Any combination of Wind and Brass instruments. Piano, keyboard or guitar etc are permitted as accompaniment. Accompanist may be teacher or professional. These items may be conducted if required and the conductor can be a teacher or professional.

821 LARGER ENSEMBLE - COMPETITIVE - 13 YEARS AND UNDER: ANY MUSIC OTHER THAN JAZZ OR POPULAR STYLE

Fee £12.00 per group

Group of a minimum of 5 people

13 and younger. Up to 6 mins.

Minimum of 5 performers

Family Class

Please enter the group name and number of individuals in the group ONLY (do not enter the names of the individuals) - this will enable you to change the composition of the group without needing to change your entry.

822 WOODWIND AND BRASS - FAMILY CLASS - NON-COMPETITIVE

Fee £9.50

Group of a minimum of 2 people

Up to 6 mins.

Minimum of two related players

Concerto - Woodwind & Brass

One or more movements of a concerto (or similar) up to the specified time limit.

Orchestral parts must be played as a piano arrangement. Only the performance of the soloist will be adjudicated.

823 CONCERTO - 15 AND UNDER

Award: Winner £20 donated by Gavin Henderson.

Fee £15.50

14 and younger. Up to 12 mins.

824 CONCERTO - 16 TO 19 YEARS

Award: Winner: £40 donated by Gavin Henderson.

Fee £19.00

Age between 15 and 19. Up to 15 mins.
